The AICP is APA's professional institute and provides the only nationwide, independent verification of planners' qualifications. Certified planners pledge to uphold high standards of practice, ethics, and professional conduct, and to keep their skills sharp and up to date by continuously pursuing advanced professional education.



OnePath to AICP

- * Step One: Register (\$255)
 - * Confirm you'll abide by the Code of Ethics
 - * Agree to the Certification Agreement
 - * Schedule Testing Appointment with Prometric
 - * In-person or remote
- * Step 2: Test (\$0)
 - * Upon passing, use the "AICP Candidate" designation
 - * Gain the required experience
- * Step 3: Apply for Certification (\$255)





Step 1: Register

- * Register and submit fee at https://planning.org/certification/register/
- * You will be asked:
 - * To abide by AICP Code of Ethics
 - Agree to the Certification Agreement confirming you understand the eligibility requirements
 - * To Confirm that you have read the AICP Certification Guide



Step 1: Register

Scheduling Exam Appointments

- * AICP will send a confirmation email with an eligibility ID and instructions on how to set up your exam appointment with Prometric.
- * You must have your eligibility ID to schedule the exam appointment.
 - * You will be asked for the ID to confirm you're eligible.

 Test can be taken at any Prometric Center or remotely
- * Once the exam is scheduled, you will receive a 16digit confirmation number via email. DO NOT LOSE THIS NUMBER



Step 1: Register

Transfers and Appointment Changes

- * All schedule changes must be completed at least 48 hours before existing appointment
- * Log into Prometric, enter the 16 digit confirmation number and choose to cancel or reschedule
- * Prometric charges a \$35 fee for cancelling or rescheduling an exam 2-29 days before the scheduled test date
- * Refer to AICP exam guide for transferring to a different exam window. A \$100 fee applies



Step 2: Pass the Exam

- * Once you pass the exam, you may use the "AICP Candidate" designation
- * Added to your APA profile
- * Access to a digital certificate that can be linked to email signature, resume, etc



- * Must be a current member of APA
- * Must Pass the AICP Exam
- * Must Complete one of the combination of education and corresponding years of professional planning experience

Bachelor's degree in planning from a PAB-accredited program	3

No college degree/no degree information provided	8



Professional Planning Experience

- * Demonstrate a Professional Level of Responsibility and Resourcefulness
- * Evaluate Multiple Impacts to a Community When Implementing Professional Planning Tasks
- * Influence Public Decision-Making in the Public Interest



Experience Requirements

- * Types of work NOT generally considered professional experience:
 - * Subdivision design
 - * Site design work
 - * Traffic engineering
 - * Land surveying or mapping
 - * Community organization or social work
 - * Work at a pre-professional level
 - * Elected and appointed officials



Five Sections

- * Section 1: Education History
 - * Confirm Educational Achievement
- * Section 2: Employment History
 - Enter professional planning employment information for each position needed to meet the requirement
- * Section 3: Planning Experience Assessment
 - * Demonstrate that your experience meets the requirement
- * Section 4: Summary & Review
- Section 5: Submit & Payment
 - * Includes initial AICP dues

Computer-based Exam

- * Arrive 30 minutes before scheduled appointment
- * Make sure you know where the test center is!
- * 2 Forms of ID (Passport, driver's license, SSA Card, etc. [see Bulletin])
- * Name on ID must match name on your Authorization to Test

Computer-based Exam

Timing

- * Testing appointment is 4 hours
- * 3 ½ hours for 170 questions
- 20 questions are pre-test and do not count
- 30 minutes for brief tutorial and brief questionnaire at end

What Not to Bring

- * Provided ...
 - * Scratch paper
 - * Secure locker
 - * Calculator
- * Do **NOT** bring in ...
 - * Books or reference materials
 - * Phone or device
 - * Watch
 - * Jacket, etc.

Basically, bring in NOTHING!!



Test Taking Tips

- * Plan to go through the exam 2-3 times
- * First, answer all the "easy" questions
- * Mark questions you cannot immediately answer and go on at once to next question
- * After first run-through take a breath!
- * Go through second time and answer all questions or a third time for the really tough ones
- * Enter your best guess there is no penalty



Study Tips

- * Start early and continue to refresh
- * Flash cards for rote knowledge
- Memorize significant dates and events
- * Take practice tests but not for content
- Focus on your weak areas
- * Think in terms of a National perspective
- * Based on an assumption that the taker works in a municipal planning office



Study Tips

- * Know current trends
- * Read current material
 - * PAS Reports, Planning Magazine, and JAPA
- * Study the AICP Code of Ethics
- * Focus on citizen participation issues
- * U.S. Census Go to <u>www.census.gov</u>
 - * Exam includes 2010 Census but trends, not information specific to any geography.
- * Find a study partner or group. Your Chapter PDO can help to connect you with others that are also studying.



Exam Overview

- * 2017 release of a new test
- Testing the application of planning knowledge and experience
- * Reduced emphasis on rote memorization of facts and figures
- More decision making on the part of examinees
- Current practice and emerging trends

- * Great breadth of subject matter, not depth
- * Many questions require professional judgment, intermixed with technical knowledge



Exam Overview

- * Familiarity with the public planning process:
 - * planners' roles;
 - responsibilities of planning commissions and zoning boards;
 - * zoning and decision making;
 - * public hearing process;
 - * citizen participation
- * "What would you do" planning process questions
- * Emphasis on agency management, policy and decision making, citizen participation & ethics

Step 5: Familiarize yourself with taking an exam

- Many haven't taken an exam in a few years.
- Practice exams help you take a test and help identify areas of knowledge that need additional study.
- Do NOT use example questions as a source of facts and knowledge.
- Non-APA source questions may not closely approximate the structure of actual exam questions.
- APA also provides <u>AICP Exam Illustrative</u> <u>Questions</u>.

When You Pass...

- * Look for "official" confirmation
- * AICP dues upon applying for Certification after meeting all other requirements
 - \$100 \$190 (salary-based)
- * APA / AICP dues combined \$260-\$575
- * Chapter Dues: Vary by chapter
- * See your PDO and APA website about Certification Maintenance http://www.planning.org/cm/index.htm



Certification Maintenance ("CM")

- * Mandatory Certification Maintenance Program approved by AICP Commission on April 13, 2007
- * 32 CM credits of "eligible professional development activities"
- * 2-year cycle
- * New AICP members: January 1 following passage and payment of AICP dues



Certification Maintenance ("CM")

- * 4-month grace period to achieve credit requirements (usually)
- * Up to 16 credits may be carried over to next cycle
- * Planners must earn a minimum of 1 credits in each cycle for the following:
 - * Ethics
 - * Current Planning Law
 - * Equity
 - * Sustainability & Resilience (Subject to Change)



Certification Maintenance ("CM")

- * Activities that qualify for CM Credit
 - Attending an approved CM Activity
 - Speaking/Instructing at an approved CM Activity
 - Self-Reporting Attendance, Pro Bono
 Planning Service or Speaking/Instructing at
 an activity that is not registered for CM
 credit.
 - Authoring an Article
- * CM program is always evolving
